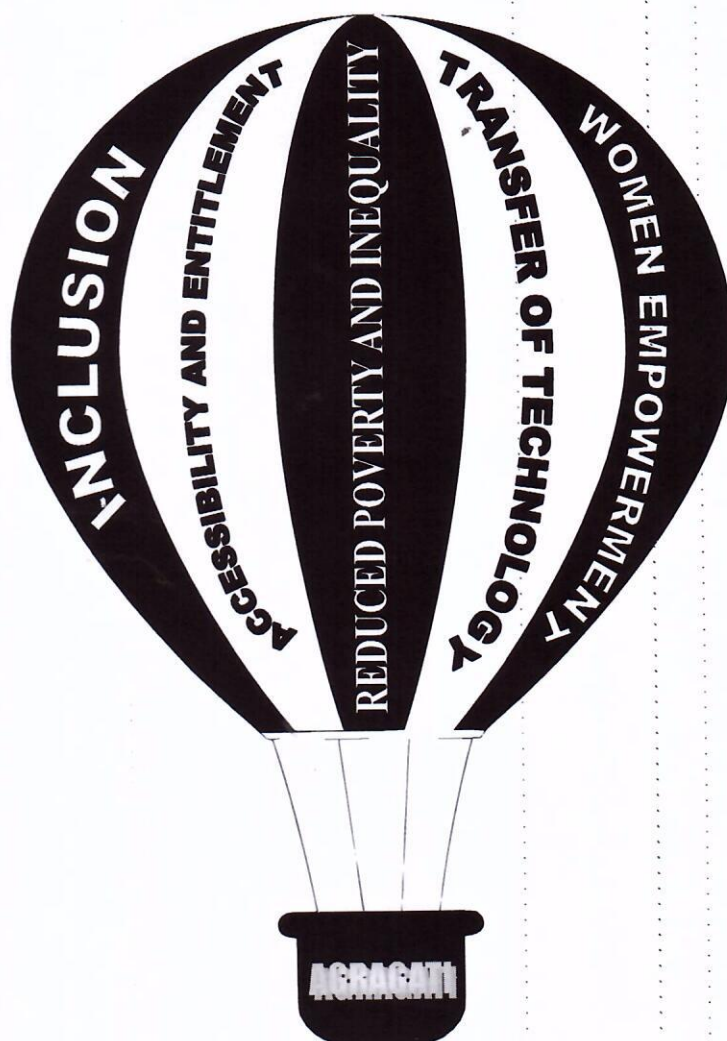

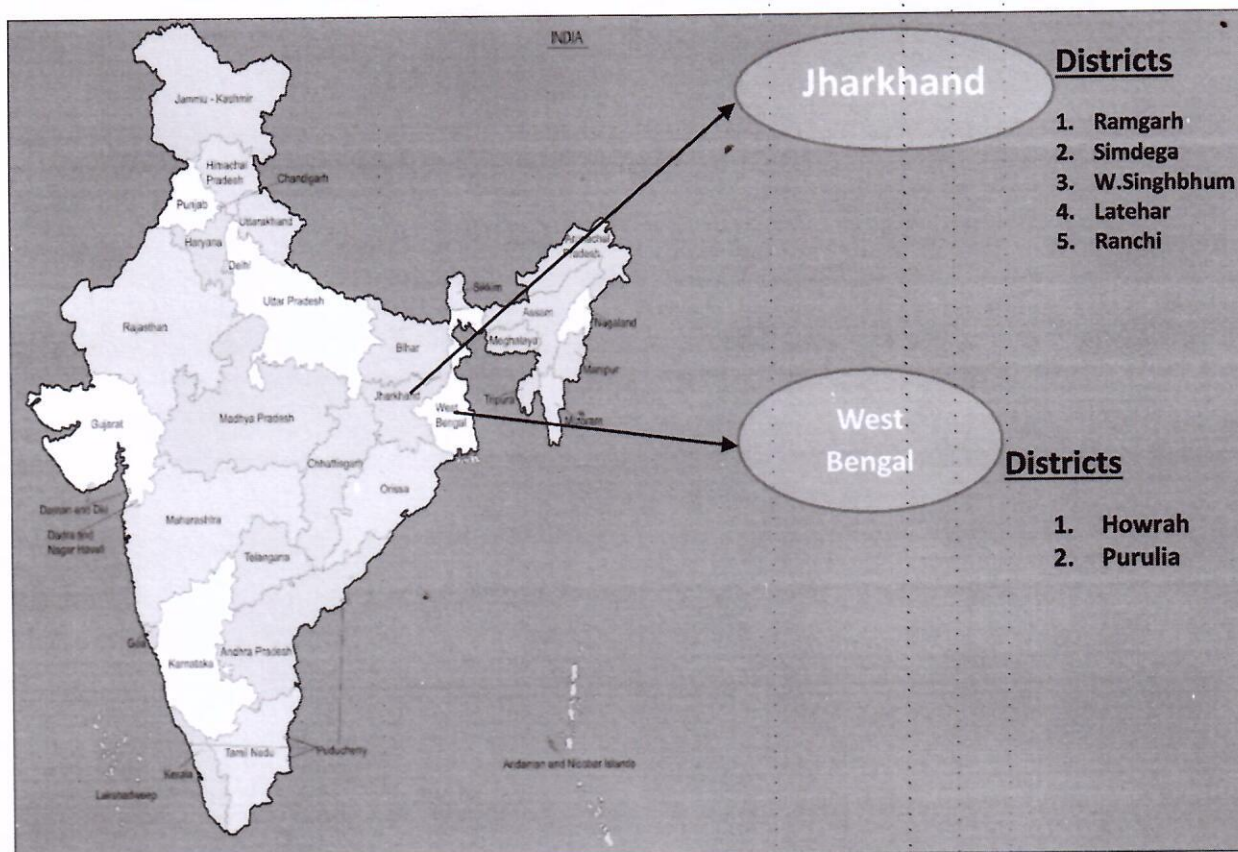

Working with communities, youth, self-help groups and community-based organisations for equal participation of their development process. Creating an environment where youth's voices are heard and considered for inclusive development.

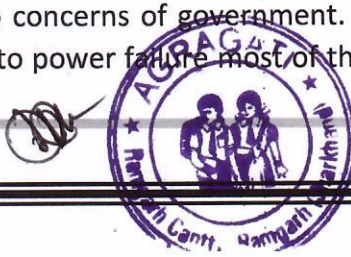
MAJORE MILESTONE OF THE YEAR:

Aragati gives more emphasis on the transforming of lives for any segment of community to lead a quality life in the society. In this year we have tried to main stream the youths through counselling them to choose right carries for their future. In this year we are offering to council youth for their choice base initiative.

In the present context of Jharkhand many youths were dropped out from their main course of education and moving around aimlessly to look for livelihood options, they were given proper guidance to identify their qualities, skill and indigenous knowledge-potentialities to go for the suiting jobs for their better earning to lead a better life.

There are five (5) Farmers Producers Organization in Ramgarh district formed with the support and guidance of NABARD. These five FPOs are now becoming more business oriented. They are putting their efforts to explore better market options to sale their products to get better return. All of these FPOs have very good linkages with the local government and concerning administration for market linkages and exploration for long run.

Aragati have taken an initiative with the financial support of SELCO Foundation and TERRI to promote green and clean energy. We are aware that affordable and clean energy is one of another agendas of SDG and also concerns of government. It cannot be ignored in this present situation of Jharkhand. Due to power failure most of the time farmers do lose their cultivation or earning for the day.

Social Developmental Activities

AGRAGATI Initiatives for Education

Agragati Primary Teachers' Training Institute (PTTI)

In the broad context we are trying to provide higher education and professional degree to the educated youth and women who are join to school education system as a teacher. It was after a long time and hard efforts; we got recognized by National Council of Teacher Education (NCTE) and affiliated to West Bengal Board of Primary Education for the course in the year 2011 for D.El.Ed Course. Up to 2000 students are enrolled and achieve the degree through the institution. At present 45 trainees are undergoing the D.El.Ed Course in this properly managed Institute. The functioning of the Institute is done in well-furnished accommodation & library and the faculties of the Institute have earned much praise from the guardians & trainers. The managing committee and the faculties have been sincerely working for the progress of the Institute and it has already become an ideal Institute and it desires to have Quality Assurance in future.

Yoga & Naturopathy Institute:

Yoga and Naturopathy education is imparted in education system through various colleges located in different part of the country as well as West Bengal. Keeping in mind the Sustainable Development Goals -3 '*Good Health and Well Being*', AGRAGATI has vowed to build physical and mental well-being and a healthy society. In consulting with the West Bengal Yoga and Naturopathy Council. The Health & Family Welfare Department. Ayush Dept. one year Diploma Course has been running. Through the education system AGRAGATI wants to educate and trained youth, women and progressive people on yoga and naturopathy, those who can give a healthy society to the country with social services. This year 05 students enrolled in this course. Some photos of the course:

National Child Labour School (Special Training Centre)

Provision is made for residential school for providing education and vocational skill development of child labourers with support from Ministry of Labour & Employment, Govt. of India through NCLP, Howrah. This year 100 students enrolled. Two schools are functioning smoothly under the management of the Organization – one at Deorah Village in Udang II Gram Panchayat and the other at Narit Village in Tajpur Gram Panchayat. Total No. of students in these two schools is one hundred (fifty in each school). They are belonging to Drop-out students and engage probably zari works and disguised labour also. The students are being served mid-day-meal every day along with their academic activities done for them, almost all the students have Bank A/cs to save their stipend given by the govt. Some of the students are yet to open their A/cs. Mainstreaming of the students is twenty-three gradually going on after completion of their education in NCLP schools.

New Dawn Model School (CBSE)

AGRAGATI has been to mainstream children and youth who are excluded from the light of appropriate education in vulnerable and isolated areas by providing quality education through non-formal means and through night school. We have observed that children do not attend school as a result of inadequate infrastructure, unmotivated parents, and poverty. Additionally, children are work as labourers from an early age to support the family. From this vantage point, we're attempting to connect with deliver the quality education who can access better and quality education from on 15 February 2020. With this in mind, we have developed a number of initiatives.

AGRAGATI established a school namely **New Dawn K.G. Primary School** to educate the children from class one (1) to four (4). In the year 12 student are enrolled.



30th Damodar Mela

Inspired and support from ICCO Netherland, AGRAGATI organized Damodar Mela since 1992. Currently, this mela is being conducted with the support and cooperation of some government departments and self-sustaining way. The mela is with a focus on the environmental concerns around the river Damodar and commercialization of rural produce (Rural Hat) and development of handicraft scaling. Members from the villagers to look closely at the other issues that are impacting the river.

This year Damodar Mela was organized by AGRAGATI held in this year during 7th -13rd December 2022 at Rashpur School Football playground. The Damodar mela was attended by villagers from the neighboring villages and political and social activists and writers from different part of West Bengal and neighboring states.

The activists at the Mela brought up important issues like the necessity of bringing people's voices together to discuss the various effects of pollution and water diversion on their daily lives. They argued that this could only be done democratically and in accordance with the priorities and recognition of local self-governing Panchayti Raj Institutions operated by the people themselves. They asked for giving the Damodar more priority, comparable to the importance being given to the Ganga Action Plan. Glimpses of the activity:



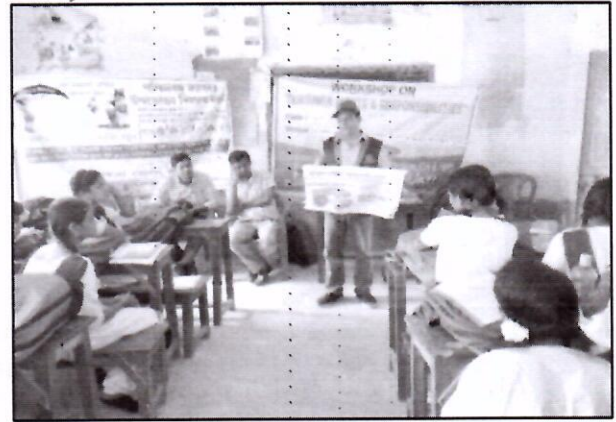
Awareness Programme under Directorate of Consumer Affairs & Fair Business Practices (CA&FBP)

But he always had a positive approach and confident towards life and made sure these problems did not affect him. He was worked in a photo studio in Ranchi and earns Rs. 4000/- per month for his family support. After getting training from our organisation and engagement of the project, we council him as well as train him to start his own business. Beside we also provided him with a fellowship (Enterprise fellowship) of Rs. 35000/- for starting his enterprise. Currently he has started his own photo studio at Digwar Chowk and earns Rs. 12000/- per month through it. He is a popular rural entrepreneur in his areas and inspiring other youths to become self-reliant by owning their own businesses.

Success Story	<p>Solar Freeze Model make for a green and clean enterprise</p> <p>Away from Ramgarh city lies Sosokhurd village, Sosokala Panchayat, a quiet rural setting. The men of the villages here are busy with their agricultural work, while women look after their households. But during lean times, the family's income dips. This is where Agragati stepped in.</p> <p>In our Green and Clean Energy project core objective is entrepreneurship development of rural youth and job creation through utilizing green and clean energy. We first have small meetings in villages about use of green energy and then we found an enthusiastic people Yogendra Mahato 42, further we found he was unable to find jobs due to lack of innovation and low skills. Our first step was to form different interested groups to aware and support basic knowledge these youth on how to use the green energy for income generation. We also introduced them enterprise-oriented skills such as sewing machine, pottery, CSC, MSC, spray charging points, Solar Freeze business model and more.</p> <p>Yogendra progressively came forward to start their own enterprise decided on hotel business where refrigerators will run through solar with the support of our project intervention. A scoping study showed solar refrigerator run smoothly, which does not require electricity and keeps cold drinks and vegetables for hotels as nicely as a normal freeze.</p> <p>During the year in summer season, he gained Rs10000/- additional net profit which in year Rs.40000/-</p> <p>The Agragati team motivated other 4 interested youth and taught them how to start the same business in the local areas.</p> <p>All the 4 persons started their enterprise. After that the 4 peoples started with an initial investment of Rs20000/- in their venture and today earns Rs8000/- per month. We are also in the process of helping and promote the youth find bigger entrepreneurship model in which such type of solar system can be used in business with the use of green energy and less capital investment.</p>

The CHILDLINE team member reached the spot and met the child. On interrogation, it was revealed that a woman named Jhanu, who works nearby her home and was known to her parents had told her father to give them a job in Kolkata as the family situation is not good, her father agrees.</p> <p>The child says that they were not allowed to leave the hotel. They plan to escape from the hotel, somehow impressing those who held them back. They said we are not going anywhere, we will buy some cheeps, fast food, soap, oil, etc. Let us go to the market once. After that they call home from an unknown person phone in the local market. They told the people in the market that a woman had brought them to sell and started crying and also informed her parents that they have brought them to be sold and are now kept in a hotel.</p> <p>A kind hearted person informed the local police and then police informed CWC Ramgarh.</p> <p>CHILDLINE team then searched for the child's address and informed the concerned Police Station. After that the women Jhanu arrested and took him under the custody. CHILDLINE team handover the 2 children to her parents. Later we find out that these 2 children are living happily and peacefully with their families and are studying well.</p>
