### 01. Damodar Mela, a Public Interest Innovation village fair:

#### a) Inauguration:






come to this school and the guardians speak highly of this school as the result of their wards is satisfactory in the formal schools and technical institutions.

# 08. Agragati Yoga and Naturopathy Institute (AYNI):
